Thank you so much for your faithful prayers for us during this pregnancy. These last two months since we first went to the hospital, David and I (Meg) have experienced God's abundant faithfulness both physically and spiritually. Truly, the Lord has carried us daily through the unknown. We are so grateful to report that I am still pregnant with the baby growing right where he or she needs to be. I am still in Memphis on bed rest at my parents' home, where we are stable and extremely thankful to be 36 weeks pregnant (almost full-term). There is still a risk for complications, but we are only a couple of weeks from a planned delivery around February 10.

Last week was my (David's) last week to make the 16 hour round-trip "commute" to Athens from Memphis since Meg's pregnancy risks could mean the baby arriving any day now. During these few unique months, I have been focusing my time (outside of playing Mr. Mom) on helping our Associate Director lead our staff team while also zeroing in on the 9 guys in my leadership group and their ministries. Now that I am "stuck" in Memphis until after the baby's birth, I find myself somewhat limited to simply praying for the ministry and interceding for these guys and the ways they are trusting God to use them. I told them I wanted to ask our entire ministry team to pray specifically for them alongside me, so here are some specific things some of them have said they would like prayer for. It is such a treat to work with such sharp guys. Please join us in praying for them!

Please continue to pray that the baby's lungs will be developed when he/she is born, and pray that this little one doesn't have cystic fibrosis. And pray for Ford as he gains a new brother or sister-- he continues to be happy and full of life through all of these unexpected life changes. Pray that he will again adjust to another big change!!

We are also thrilled to tell you that Ford's treatment vest has been paid in full. He is battling a bit of a cold that is lingering in his lungs, but he is fighting it off successfully! Thanks so much for all your help, encouragement and prayers!

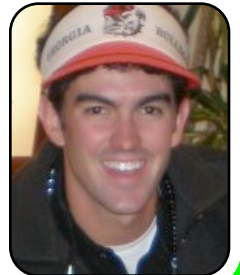
evan (JR.), community group
